Monica (25) and her fiancé, Joe (29), had been homeless for nine years prior to the birth of their son, Trevor. After his birth, the couple used their stimulus checks to pay for weekly lodgings, working to keep their infant son out of homelessness. As their stimulus funds ran out, they sought assistance at local shelters but were forced to separate when these shelters were unable to accept families. While on a waitlist for housing, the family was referred to HopeLink, allowing us to provide them with emergency shelter for a month. During this time, Monica, Joe and Trevor were able to stay together and our team worked with them on a solution to get them qualified for our HomeLink program. Through our efforts, the family is living together in their first home in 9 years and their son is a safe, healthy, cheerful, and happy infant!

HopeLink of Southern Nevada was founded in 1991 with a vision of creating a community where everyone has a safe place to call home. We serve residents in Southern Nevada with housing, food, medical, employment, shelter, utility and low-income homeless assistance programs. We are a designated Family Resource Center (FRC) in Clark County operating on charitable investments from individuals, corporate giving, foundations, grants and annual fundraising events.

WHAT WE DO

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

Assist families and individuals in crisis with emergency food assistance, bus passes, Nevada IDs or birth certificates and referrals for mental health, legal, low-cost medical clinics and many other resources.

DIVERSION

Work strategically with the community to prevent people from needing community services and to avoid homelessness.

EMERGENCY SHELTER

Provide emergency shelter for families and individuals not best served in mass shelters.

RENT AND UTILITY ASSISTANCE

Provide rent and utility assistance to qualified Clark County residents by utilizing federal, state and local grants.

WRAP AROUND SERVICES

Prevent families who may be at risk of intervention from the Department of Family Services by proactively providing resources to stop these situations from occurring and ensure families don't need them in the future.

SOUTHERN NEVADA OUTREACH

Partner with other community organizations to support underserved communities throughout Southern Nevada.

HUD (Housing & Urban Development) and CCHIP (Clark County Housing Intervention Program) Rapid Rehousing
Help families fleeing dangerous or emergency situations who need immediate shelter and move families out of shelters in to housing by partnering with various groups including Child Protective Services to assist families.
